

# Appeal official visits victims

A charity official has returned to Bradford following a ten-day mission to help those affected by the earthquake that struck Pakistan two years ago.

Yousaf Razaq, of the Bradford-based Human Relief Foundation, went to Muzaffarabad in the Kashmir region of the country to see how £250,000 of charity money has been spent so far.

Mr Razaq officially opened 20 shelters which house more than

100 people as well as attending a mass food gathering to feed 3,000 people and handing gifts out to more than 1,000 people.

Mr Razaq said: "So far HRF has spent just under £250,000 over the last two years and will continue to invest in the rehabilitation of the communities in Muzaffarabad for the long-term.

"The local and national community should carry on donating - there is still a lot of work to do." 16/10/2007
