

Charity sets up camp for survivors

A Bradford-based charity has started to help survivors of the South Asia earthquake get on with their lives by setting up a new village base.

A team of staff and volunteers from The Human Relief Foundation (HRF) have set up a camp for some 4,000 survivors one-and-a-half miles

from the devastated city of Muzaffarabad in Kashmir.

Yousaf Razaq, project coordinator, left, told the Telegraph & Argus that the team travelled to the area accompanied by four trucks full of aid.

HRF have been allocated a piece of land in Thuri Park to house 500 families.

Mr Razaq said the level of devastation in the region was unbelievable.

"There are still people trapped under the buildings and people are not doing anything to get them out.

"Maintaining hygiene and sanitation is a big problem. The city stinks."
